## Youth Missions Trip - Tohono O'odham Indian Reservation

One of our objectives with HBM has been to provide hands-on mission field experiences to the people of our churches. Over the years, we have led many trips to both foreign and domestic fields. This past summer, we were able to take the youth group from our home church to minister to the Tohono O'odham native Americans in southern Arizona. This experience was special in that we were able to be involved

over the entire ten month process of fund raising (over \$12K), field preparation, and then ministering with them on the mission field. Our teens were challenged to develop and conduct "day camps" on the reservation (four 8 hour days) at two different reservation locations. They did a phenomenal job, making us all very proud. The gospel was shared, kids were shown the love of Christ, and several made professions of faith. What a great experience this was for all involved. Next up, Kris and I are in the beginning stages of

#### **HBM Missionary Spotlight**

The David Laodima Family - The work in Togo continues to flourish. I spent several weeks this Fall working on a Comprehensive Ministry update for Bro. David that is presently being sent to all of his supporters. What a joy it is to see this robust and thriving work in Togo. David and his team have started nine churches, a Bible Institute, provide work/skill training for their people, and have eleven orphans at their Redeemer House orphanage. I am also working with David and Justine to develop a program designed to get more financial support for the orphanage. While they currently house eleven kids, they have the capacity to care for a total of sixty children. However, more finances are required before they can realistically grow. In the near future, we will be rolling out a "sponsorship program," soliciting regular financial gifts to care for the ongoing support of a child in the orphanage. \$50 per month is what is

currently needed to provide for their housing, clothing, food, and education.

#### **The Shawn Bowman Family**

- It is exciting to see how the Lord is continuing to guide this family and their ministry in Ireland. A significant prayer need is an upcoming (early 2017) visa application for permanent residency. Up to this point, they have been required to be approved on an annual basis and have always run the risk of being

denied. The permanent residency status they will be applying for will eliminate the need to continually re-apply. The cost of such an application is also quite high (\$4500-\$6000). The Lord has been blessing an appeal that Bro. Shawn recently made to his supporters and much of this has already been received. Please continue to pray for this family.

# **Ministry Activities Update**



The biblical counseling ministry that was started following my ACBC certification in 2014 has continued to flourish. My regular counseling load each week fluctuates, typically consists of around ten active clients. These folks are from both our church as well as churches surrounding our area. Many have been helped through the timeless principles and truths from God's Word

as it proves over and over again that it is completely sufficient for "all things that pertain unto life and godliness" (2 Pet. 1:3). It continues to be my desire to teach biblical counseling on the mission field, better equipping our missionaries to help others grow in Christ-likeness through the medium of counseling. As with all other aspects of our HBM ministries, all counseling continues to be provided free of charge.

#### **PureMen**

For almost ten years now, I have been teaching the PureMen study at CRBC - Teaching Men to be Passionate About Purity. Our 9th PureMen study started in September and will continue weekly (Wednesday nights) for the next six months.

While the theme of this study has been finding lasting freedom from addiction, its primary focus has been discipleship - making men more like Jesus Christ. I certainly do appreciate your prayers as there is a constant spiritual battle that rages when you confront strongholds in a person's life. Praise the Lord, "where sin abounded, grace did much more abound." (Rom. 5:20).
