



Dear Pastor and Brethren,

September 29, 2022

We are sending you our warm greeting from Togo, West-Africa. We hope you are doing well.

Many years ago, the Lord taught me in a special way three things that definitely become part of my life:

- (1) It is sad that “the children of this world” are wiser in worldly matters (show more acumen) than the “children of light” in spiritual matters (Luke 16: 8);
- (2) God’s children ought to use their wealth or money for soul winning purposes (Luke 16: 9);
- (3) “Necessity is laid upon me” to preach the Gospel “by all means” in order to “save some” (1 Cor. 16: 22).

Bearing all this in mind, we have been asking the Lord to help us start a Christian School. Actually, I personally had no rest until I put all my mind, all my strength, all my means and applied all my faith in this endeavor. The Lord has answered our prayers: He brought into existence our Christian School. What looked impossible is done and this is the beginning. Currently we have 78 pupils. We want to be able to have a high school and even a boarding school in future. We are planning on using the school facilities for VBS and camp ministry. As you can see, we still have a long way to go. Please, be in prayer with us.



The girls and boys at Redeemer House are doing well. Here they are in their school outfits. As you can they are growing so fast. This year five are in Senior High School, five in Junior High School and three are in Primary School. God willing, two of them, René and Jeoffroy will graduate from High School.

As you know, four of our mission’s churches are in the process of constructing their church buildings. We are actively praying and raising funds in order to make the concrete at **Good Shepherd Baptist Church, Yokoé**, by November 2022. We need about \$16000 for the concrete. Once again this seems impossible, especially at this time of economic crisis. Instead of giving up, we rather made up our mind to go by faith. Please, join us in our prayer.
